


Additional servers are needed at all weekend liturgies and for funeral and wedding masses.

# Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.

Palm branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday.

The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These may be returned to the church, or kept for the year.

Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the follow year's Ash Wednesday observance.

The colors of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.

This week's topic at OCIA will be "The Liturgies of Holy Week and the Triduum We will meet in the church hall.

Prayer Blanket Ministry - This ministry is to provide hope, comfort and healing. It is a unique way of reaching out to the community in a very simple and tangible way. A prayer blanket can be seen as a symbolic "hug" from God. Spreading the message of God's mercy, love and compassion. If you would like a prayer blanket please stop by the parish office during office hours.

### **Parish Hall**

If you are a parish group that uses the Parish Hall this is for you. There have been numerous occasions after the use of the hall that volunteers have to go down and put things away/clean up. Here are a few things to consider that need to be done after any group use.

- The sound system/projector screen. This must to be shut down correctly and the screen put away after each use
- Tables—if a table is taken out from the closet to use, please wipe it down and put it away when done.
- Perishables— Please make sure not to "store" anything in the hall walkin. They get forgotten then rot or spoil.
- Now required by each group, i.e., Knights, Catholic Daughters, Social Concerns, Foundation, Prayer Group, (sorry if I am missing anyone), will need to pick up a Rental Agreement for Use of Church Facilities. This will need to be reviewed by each group, signed and returned to the parish office.
- If you use any of the ovens or stovetops, those also must be cleaned after use.
- If you DO meet in the parish hall, it is YOUR group responsibility to make sure it is on the Church Master Calendar.
- REMEMBER, we have this beautiful, <u>new</u>, facility to use. Let's keep it looking nice. The old saying "Leave it better than you found it." should apply.

#### Columbarium

We know that the Columbarium and personal niches are extremely important to some people and especially the families who have loved ones there. When each family purchases a niche, they sign a form regarding the clean-lness and uniformity of each niche and the Columbarium area. I would like to remind the church community of these guidelines and ask that they are followed. If you are wanting to place flowers for a birthday, anniversary or such, please contact the parish office before so we are aware, and please remove them in a reasonable timeline.

### What is signed by the person purchasing a Niche.

- 9. Holy Family Church arranges for the maintenance of the Columbarium. Nothing of either a permanent or temporary nature shall be affixed to or on the Columbarium.
- 12. The use of any ornamentation on or proximate to any niche by any subscriber is prohibited. The Church will be responsible for plants or cut flowers or seasonal decorations at specific times during the year and arranges for the maintenance of the Columbarium.

# The most popular questions about Palm Sunday — and their answers

### What is the meaning of Palm Sunday?

Palm Sunday is the day we remember and honor Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem before his crucifixion. As Jesus entered the city on a donkey, people gathered and laid palm branches and their cloaks across Jesus' path, shouting: "Hosanna to the Son of David!" It is also significant because it fulfilled Old Testament prophecies. For example, Jesus rode into the city on a donkey, fulfilling the prophecy found in Zechariah 9:9.

### Why do we use palm branches on Palm Sunday?

The palm symbolized victory in the ancient world. All four Gospels tell us that people cut branches from palm trees and laid them across Jesus' path and waved them in the air as he entered Jerusalem triumphantly a week before his death. As the Church enters Holy Week, the faithful use palms to commemorate his victory and Jesus' passion liturgically.

### Is Palm Sunday a holy day of obligation in the Catholic Church?

Yes. Since every Sunday is a holy day of obligation, Palm Sunday is also a holy day of obligation.

### Are Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday the same?

Yes. Palm Sunday can also be referred to as Passion Sunday. Palm Sunday comes from the fact that it honors Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem, where the people carried palm branches. It also is called Passion Sunday because the Gospel narrative of Jesus' passion is read on this Sunday.

# Letter from Father

24 March 2024 Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion Friendship and Grace

Greetings,

Last Wednesday, the Diocese of Spokane gathered at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Lourdes to celebrate the annual Chrism Mass. It was a beautiful event in which the priests of the diocese renewed our priestly promises and the sacred oils for the coming year were blessed and consecrated. During the afternoon before the Chrism Mass, the priests gathered to hear some talks by Bishop Frank Shuster, auxiliary bishop of Seattle, and have the opportunity to go to Confession (yes, indeed, priests go to confession). This was a particularly surprising day for me as Bishop Shuster and I worked together in several youth ministry events before either of us were priests. I was sure that he wouldn't recognize me as it has been at least twenty-five years since last we saw each other. I even got to sit next to him during the Chrism Mass which brought about a reflection on my part regarding how it is that God surprises us.

If you had asked me thirty years ago if I thought that either Frank or I would be priests, my answer would probably have been something like, "Frank? Maybe. Me? Probably not." Bishop Shuster spoke of his surprise at being called to the episcopacy and how it was probably the most unexpected thing to have ever happened to him. This got me thinking that sometimes God uses very surprising people to show us His desires for us.

The virtue of friendship is more than just the nice feelings that one has for the people whom he finds to be pleasant. Friendship is something very important to most people. In fact, St Augustine believed that in this world two things are essential: life and friendship. God created people to breathe and be alive. But mere life is not enough: if a human being is to be a real person then there must be friendship. He wrote that when we are children and adolescents, our friendships tend to be self-centered, as a child might be, in seeking friends that is able do things for us and then based on love and admiration as an adolescent might seek, becoming friends with a person that one admires for a skill or trait. But, the august bishop and doctor of the Church opined, there is a deeper sense of friendship that one can only attain with the maturity of adulthood and experience.

In adulthood, Augustine's life was transformed by his conversion to faith in Jesus Christ and trust in God. He no longer saw the world as purely material. He realized that true reality is only understood when we know of God who is transcendent. Once converted to this knowledge, he sought to gather his friends together so that they could seek God together. They were then friends in Christ. St. Augustine wrote, "Love has drawn you here; but love of what: If of me, this too is good, for I desire to be loved by you, but not for myself. Since, therefore, I love you in Christ, do you in return love me in Christ, and let our love for each other sigh and groan to God."

So good St. Augie shows us that friendship in admiration of the other is good and beautiful but friendship based in the Love of God is what shows us another glimpse into the Kingdom of Heaven and nourishes us as does the Body of Christ.
