

# Have you heard of St. Peter Claver? Feast Day is September 9th

St. Peter Claver (born 1581, Verdú, Spain—died September 4, 1654, Cartagena, Colombia; canonized 1888; feast day September 9) was a Jesuit missionary to South America who, in dedicating his life to the aid of enslaved Africans, earned the title of "apostle of the Negroes."

Peter entered the Society of Jesus in 1602 and eight years later was sent to Cartagena, where he was ordained in 1616. The miserable condition of enslaved people aboard ships and in the pens of Cartagena, South America's chief slave market, caused Peter to declare himself "the slave of the Negroes forever"; he dedicated the rest of his life to alleviating their suffering. Accompanied by interpreters and carrying food and medicines, he boarded every incoming slave ship and visited the pens, where he nursed the sick, comforted the distraught and terrified captives, and taught religion. Despite strong official opposition, Peter persevered for 38 years, baptizing an estimated 300,000 enslaved individuals. He also visited them on the local plantations to encourage their faith and to exhort their masters to treat them humanely; during these visits he often refused the hospitality of the plantation owners and instead stayed in the slave quarters.

He was canonized by Pope Leo XIII, who in 1896 proclaimed him patron of all Roman Catholic missions to African peoples. Peter is also the patron saint of those in slavery and the Republic of Colombia.


#### Do you have a child in 5th grade or above who would like to be an Altar Server?

### Letter from Father

8 September 2024 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Hope and Second Chances

Greetings,

Perhaps it is the start of a new school year or the Face Book reminder that my recently deceased best friend's birthday was this week but I have been in a nostalgic, reminiscent mood of late. One afternoon last week, I started thinking about two men that I have known in my life that had lost hope and, how finding hope again, changed them for the better.

In September of 1996, I moved to Santa Ynez, CA to begin postulancy with the Capuchin Franciscans. On my first day at the retreat center where I was to work, I met Mr. Bob. He was a retired man who had appeared at the center's doorstep some twenty years prior and had never left. To earn his keep, Mr. Bob had taken on the responsibility for the maintenance of the buildings and grounds. The Mr. Bob that I met was a very angry and antisocial man. He grumbled about the retreatants and the regulars at Mass and would have been happy just to have been left alone. One day after breakfast, I walked around the corner of one of the outbuildings to find Mr. Bob sitting on a stump, bleeding profusely from his lower leg. I ran to call an ambulance and to alert the retreat director about what had happened. Mr. Bob was livid with me. As they loaded him begrudgingly into the ambulance, he hollered at me that I was a real SOB, and that was the nice thing he said. It turns out that Mr. Bob thought that he was dying of cancer as he had found a lump in his abdomen and knew he was in trouble. He stopped taking his blood pressure and diabetes meds as a means of hastening his death and being done with it. As it was, he had a hernia, not cancer and, after a prolonged stay in the hospital and convalescent care, he returned to the retreat center a changed man. He was still pretty gruff but he apologized to me and thanked me for getting him the help he needed that day. He said that when he thought that he had cancer, he just gave up hope and prepared to die in pain. He stayed on at the retreat center until his death a couple of years later and was a totally different man. I like to think that regaining hope had a lot to do with his last days being peaceful ones.

The other man is a young man who has had a difficult life to say the least. He has faced addiction and criminal behavior, the two working against each other to keep him from living the life that he dreamed of. A few years ago, his girl-friend at the time informed him that she was pregnant and that he was going to have to take care of her. While she continued to struggle with substance abuse, up until the birth of their son, he took fatherhood to heart. Their son was born and his blood tested positive for methamphetamine. He was taken into protective custody by the state. My friend was devastated. He had tried so hard to do the right thing and, once again, had come up short. When he called me to ask what he should do, I told him that he should keep doing what he had started when he found out that he was a dad. Keep working on sobriety, keep working with his parole officer to get clear of his legal obligations, keep improving himself physically, emotionally, and spiritually, if not for himself, then for the sake of his son. He realized that the work that he had done in the past nine months was worth more than all of the trouble he had gotten into throughout his life and, with a renewed sense of purpose, he pressed on. Happily, after almost two years of hard work and dedication, he gained sole custody of his son and is an amazing father for him. He has a good job and spends so much time showing his son how to be a good man.

Both of these men were on the verge of abandoning hope but they found it again. The theological virtue of hope is the power by which we desire the Kingdom of Heaven as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the grace of the Holy Spirit. Jesus will give us the graces that we need for the journey to Heaven. The gift of hope helps us to open our heart to His mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, to receive for-giveness and healing. Lifted up by hope, we are preserved from turning inward in selfishness and led to the happiness that flows from focusing outward toward others and living with charity toward our neighbor, especially helping those in need. When we need the gift of hope to be increased, the most important thing we can do is ask for it. Hope is expressed and nourished in prayer, especially in the Our Father, the summary of everything that hope leads us to desire. In the words of St. Paul in his letter to the Romans, "Let us trust in Jesus Christ for He is trustworthy. It is through the merits of His Passion, Death, and Resurrection that God keeps us in the "hope that does not disappoint"
