8 Things You Didn't Know About the Feast of Christ the King

On the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, more commonly known as the Feast of Christ the King, is celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year.

This feast reminds us that whatever earthly powers may do or ask of us, Christ is the true King who should reign in our hearts.

Here are eight things about this awesome feast you may not know:

1) It was instituted less than 100 years ago in 1925.

In the aftermath of the First World War, in the midst of the rise of Communism in Russia, and during the 16th centenary of the Council of Nicaea (325), Pope Pius XI instituted the feast in his 1925 encyclical Quas Primas, though its first celebration took place in 1926.

2) It was first celebrated on Halloween in 1926

It was originally supposed to be the last Sunday of October, just before the Feast of All Saints – which in 1926, just happened to be October 31st.

- 3) In 1969, Pope Paul VI revised the feast, giving it its current name and date Pope Paul VI gave the feast its current full title (the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe) and moved it to the last Sunday of the liturgical year.
- 4) The feast was a response to the rise of secularization, atheism, and communism While the world was increasingly telling Christians that they must compartmentalize their religion and give their highest allegiance to the government, Pope Pius XI wrote regarding the feast:

"If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone." (Quas Primas, 33)

- 5) Despite its recent Catholic origins, the feast is celebrated by many Protestants Even though it was created by a pope less than a hundred years ago, some Anglicans, Lutherans, Methodists, and Presbyterians celebrate the feast.
- 6) In the Protestant Church of Sweden, this Sunday is called "the Sunday of Doom" Its official name is "the Return of Christ," but its colloquial name comes from the fact that they give a particular focus on the Last Judgement at Christ's Second Coming.
 - 7) Some Anglicans refer to this Sunday as "Stir-up Sunday"

This Sunday got this name for two reasons:

- **First,** the Anglican collect for the day begins with the words, "Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people..."
- **Second**, some old pudding recipes require the pudding to sit for several weeks before being cooked. This Sunday became a day that people would traditionally begin preparing pudding for Christians, which includes "stirring it up."
- 8) The "Christ the King" statue in Poland is one of the largest statues of Jesus in the world.

At 33 meters tall (one meter for each year of Jesus' earthly life), the Christ the King statue is three meters taller than the Christ the Redeemer in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Letter from Father

24 November 2024 Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe "Come See Me Sometime"

Greetings,

The first week of Advent begins next Sunday and, as a special Advent observance, Holy Family will host the Eucharistic Miracles display in Fr. Root Hall starting on Wednesday and continuing through the first Thursday of Advent. The traveling display was created from the work of Blessed Carlo Acutis, who will be canonized as a Saint next year. During this Year of the Eucharist, it is a fitting way to begin this sacred season.

As we begin the beautiful season of Advent, I thought that it would be good to reflect on Mary and the Eucharist since Advent is the season in which Mary was pregnant with Christ's Presence within her. There are a few ways that Mary can teach us to more fully receive Christ into our lives as she perfectly did throughout her life. First of all, Mary teaches us to live the Eucharist by uniting our prayers, works, joys, and sufferings with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Communion leads to the cross, to co-redemption, to a passionate love for all people.

Mary teaches us how to fully participate in the Eucharist at Mass. She entered into the mystery and gave her full consent to her Son's gift of Himself on Calvary. She loved humanity so much that she consented to her Son's sacrificial death in order that so many could be saved. Our Lady teaches us to receive Christ well, with complete openness to God's will. She teaches us to be completely vulnerable in God's Presence. She teaches us to pour out our hearts to the Lord in prayer; to lay all of our difficulties, burdens, afflictions that are weighing heavily on our hearts, minds, and souls at the feet of her Son, especially during those precious moments when He is sacramentally present within us during Holy Communion.

As we contemplate the Eucharistic mystery we are urged to imitate Christ's gift on the cross. Jesus present in the Blessed Sacrament radiates peace and calm to our hearts. Whenever storms arise in our lives, Jesus can be our peace if we only place ourselves in His Presence and open our hearts to Him. Being in the Presence of Jesus also encourages us to reflect on our lives and what things we could change in order to be more faithful to Him.

We have many helps in the Church in order to grow in our unity with Christ, especially the sacraments. The greatest sacrament is the Eucharist, because although the other sacraments are signs of God's grace, the Eucharist is the very life of God Himself. When we receive the Eucharist a sort of reversal takes place. Normally when we consume food it becomes a part of us; on the contrary, when we receive Jesus in the Eucharist we actually become incorporated into Him; we are made capable in our capacity to love as God loves through the faithful reception of the Eucharist. One way that we can be filled with God's love is by participating in Eucharistic adoration. One cannot place themselves in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, especially with Jesus in the Sacred Host exposed on the altar, without being changed for the better. In the Blessed Sacrament, Jesus looks on us with mercy, inviting us to a deep communion and friendship with Him. Mary had the most intimate friendship with her Divine Son; therefore she can, above everyone, appreciate the supreme gift of the Most Blessed Sacrament and thus teach us reverence and love for the Eucharist.

I encourage you to take some time this Advent to unite yourself more closely to the Eucharist. There will be a holy hour every Thursday evening at 7 pm to which all parishioners are invited to participate. Come for as long as you like or as long as you can. Even just fifteen minutes in prayer before the Eucharist can help change they way you are feeling and give you strength.
