



# Letter from Father

12 January 2025 Baptism of the Lord Washed in the Blood of the Lamb

Greetings,

Last Friday morning, my cousin called from Montana to inform me that her mother, my Aunt Mary, had died. Aunt Mary was my mother's oldest sister and had been a fixture in our family's life, even after we moved to Washington. She was eighty-eight and had lived a very full life. Her death made me think about the implications of the Baptism of Jesus and what does that mean for us?

As you may know, our Church views the Sacrament of Baptism as a dying to self in Christ. It is only in this death to our own desires and motivations that we can hope to gain eternal life. So why did Jesus "need" to be baptized? He certainly didn't need to be delivered from sin and death. His baptism (and this is one of my favorite words) was the beginning of His "Supererogatory" sacrifice for our salvation.

Jesus Christ did not "have" to come for our salvation. In fact, according to our human way of thinking, He should have stayed in Heaven where he was safe and wouldn't be subject to suffering and rejection. But, as John tells us in his Gospel, "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should never die, but have everlasting life".

Jesus presented himself to John for baptism, not for his sake, but for ours. In being baptized, he showed us how to begin a life ordered towards salvation. Jesus' baptism is an act of humility, showing that he was willing to be counted as a sinner, even though he carried no guilt of sin. His baptism was also the beginning of his ministry among us. By showing us how to submit to the will of the Father, Jesus opened the way for us to the Father. Jesus' baptism symbolizes the union between Jesus and humanity, in which Jesus takes on humanity's sin so that humanity can become the righteousness of God.

Each of us are called to the Christian vocation through the grace of our Baptism. Having been baptized, we die to sin and awaken to Life. This is the first sign of hope for us as the brothers and sisters of Christ. Baptism allows us to see the beginning of God's grace and mercy in our earthly lives and prepares us for eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Mortal death is a guarantee for every one of us, there's no escaping it, but because of the grace of Baptism, we have the joyful hope that our lives do not end in darkness but beckons us on to the beauty of salvation through Jesus Christ.

# The Significance of the Baptism of the Lord

In the liturgical calendar, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord signifies the end of the Christmas season. The Baptism of the Lord is notable because it marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry and confirms his identity as the Son of God. This event is documented in all the gospels except John.

### The Trinity Displayed in the Baptism of the Lord

The Gospel of Mark describes the event:

It happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." (Mark 1:9-11)

Christ's baptism remarkably shows all three Persons of the Trinity at the same time: the Son being baptized, the Holy Spirit descending, and the Father speaking from the heavens. In this event, the Father and the Holy Spirit confirm the deity of Christ, and Jesus submits to his Father's will.

### Why Is Jesus Baptized?

When Jesus comes to John, John hesitates to baptize him. John's is a baptism of repentance, and Jesus has nothing for which he needs to repent. Why then does Jesus insist on being baptized? By choosing to be baptized, Jesus fulfills all righteousness – preparing himself to be a perfect sacrifice for us.

The account in Matthew demonstrates this:

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him. John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" Jesus said to him in reply, "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he allowed him. (Matthew 3:13-15)

#### What Does Baptism Mean for Us?

As we reflect on Christ's baptism, we are reminded of our own baptism. Pope Benedict XVI <u>said on the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord</u>:

[Baptism] is communion with the One who conquered death and holds in his hand the keys of life. Belonging to this circle, to God's family, means being in communion with Christ, who is life and gives eternal love beyond death.

## Themes for the Baptism of the Lord

- **The Baptism of Jesus:** The gospel for the Baptism of the Lord Year C describes Jesus' baptism by John, symbolizing His identification with humanity, His submission to God's will, and the beginning of His public ministry.
- **John the Baptist's Role:** The gospel for the Baptism of the Lord Year C also highlights John the Baptist's proclamation of the coming Messiah and his role as the forerunner preparing the way for Jesus' ministry.
- **The Holy Spirit:** The presence of the Holy Spirit is prominent in this passage, as the Spirit descends upon Jesus in the form of a dove, signifying His anointing and empowerment for His ministry.
- Divine Confirmation: The voice from heaven affirms Jesus as the beloved Son of God, expressing the divine confirmation of His identity and mission.
- Trinitarian Revelation: The baptism scene reveals the simultaneous presence of the Father (voice from heaven), the Son (Jesus being baptized), and the Holy Spirit (descending like a dove), providing a glimpse into the Trinitarian nature of God.
- The Call to Repentance and Obedience: John the Baptist's message of repentance and his call to bear fruits of
  righteousness resonate throughout the passage, highlighting the importance of turning away from sin and living
  a life aligned with God's will.
