### Presentation of the Lord

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is an ancient celebration in the Church. It is also called Candlemas because, on this day, candles are blessed in many parishes. These candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World. The feast is celebrated on February 2, forty days after Christmas. It recalls the day when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to present Him to God.

This event is rooted in Jewish tradition. According to the Law of Moses, every firstborn son belonged to God. Jewish parents were to bring their son to the Temple and offer a small sacrifice in thanksgiving. By bringing Jesus to the Temple, Mary and Joseph followed God's law faithfully. This act shows their humility and obedience to God.

The Church has celebrated the Presentation of the Lord for many centuries. In the early Church, people gathered in the evening for a candlelit procession, honoring Christ as the Light. February 2, exactly 40 days after Christmas, was chosen because of this tradition in Jewish law. It also marks the end of the Christmas season for some Catholic communities.

The feast celebrates three main ideas. First, Jesus is recognized as the Light of the World, a light for all people. Second, it shows that Jesus came to fulfill the law, not to destroy it. He and His family obeyed the customs of their people. Third, it honors the deep faith of Mary and Joseph, who followed God's will at every step.

In the Gospel of Luke, we read about two holy people, Simeon and Anna, who meet Jesus at the Temple. Both Simeon and Anna see that Jesus is special. They have waited their whole lives for this moment. Simeon praises God and calls Jesus a "light for revelation to the Gentiles." This points to Jesus' mission to save not only Israel but also all nations.

On Candlemas, the Church invites us to remember that Jesus brings light to our lives. Like Simeon and Anna, we are called to recognize Jesus in our world. We also look to Mary and Joseph as examples of faith and obedience.



#### This week on Formed:

On January 6, 1937, the death of a humble doorkeeper for a boys' college drew over a million people to Montreal for his funeral. For forty years, Brother André Bessette of the Congregation of Holy Cross welcomed people at the door and became known as a miraculous healer. God's Doorkeeper looks at the heart and legacy of Brother André–as a man of prayer, of hospitality, and of compassion, a man who draws people in to experience a God who is love. Brother André also had a tremendous devotion to St. Joseph that he shared with all who came in contact with him. On October 17, 2010, Brother André became the first Canadian-born male saint and the first saint for the Congregation of Holy Cross. He is living proof that "it is with the smallest brushes that the divine artist paints the most beautiful pictures."

The film features interviews from Montreal, Rome, and the United States—with people who knew him and others who continue Brother André's work today. It also includes footage of the beatification and canonization ceremonies in Rome and the celebrations in Canada, with footage of the unforgettable events of Brother André's road to sainthood.

## Letter from Father

1 February 2025 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time "Let the Children Come to Me"

Greetings,

Today brings a close to the annual celebration of Catholic Schools Week. This week is observed in the Catholic schools throughout the United States as a means of promoting and supporting the vital ministry of educating children, both in the ways of the world and in the ways of the Church. Holy Family Catholic School has a tradition more than a century old of providing quality education and human formation of our students.

This past week, our students and staff experienced a variety of activities that deepened their lives in our Faith. On Monday, each class conducted a food drive for the Asotin County Food Bank. Their goal was to collect one hundred eighty six pounds of food in order to exceed last year's total of one hundred eighty five pounds. My heart swelled with pride in the generosity of our students when the final report came in: four hundred twenty pounds! The first corporal work of mercy was met so well.

Tuesday was Station Day. Our students joined in mixed groups with children from each class. They rotated through the school and middle school building, engaging in various activities that helped to focus them on the impact of Catholic education and the role that they can play. It was inspiring to watch our upper level students lead and guide our lower level students so carefully and attentively.

Wednesday had our first through fifth grade going over to All Saints and the middle school traveling to Spokane for the Catholic Schools Week Mass. Reports from the younger students include, "It was fun!" and "We got to play with the other kids!" The middle school had the privilege to participate in the CSW Mass at the Cathedral with Bishop Daly and the largest group of students gathered for that Mass in many years. Both instances provided an opportunity for our students to see the scope of Catholic education outside of our own walls.


On Thursday, Mrs. Leavitt and Ms. Simpson designed and set up a Prayer Walk for the school in Fr. Root Memorial Hall. There were stations exploring the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary as well as tables to journal and to read the Bible. There was an opportunity to pray before the cross in private. It was a new activity that will surely become a regular tradition during Catholic Schools Week as well as the seasons of Advent and Lent.

Friday the students showed their appreciation for our teachers and staff with lunch and lots of love. Our teachers and staff are so dedicated to their work and their love for each student is readily apparent in the love and respect that our students show to each other.

Today marks the end of Catholic Schools Week. I hope that you will be as inspired as I am by the talent and generosity of our students and staff. Holy Family School is a wonderful and unique place in our community. Where else can a young person get a quality education, make friends and learn new skills, AND learn so much more about and grow in their faith? In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus said, "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." These words began the beautiful tradition of Catholic education that not only educates the mind but prepares the soul for the Kingdom of God. How blessed we are to have such an institution in our midst.
