



Letter from Father

26 January 2025 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Have Life and Have it More Abundantly

Greetings,

It is so good to be home. While I do love going home to Montana, even for a funeral, it is always good to come home.

As I got back into the pace of weekly activities, we observed as a parish and as a Church the Day of Prayer for the Right to Human Life. At our school Mass on Wednesday, I reminded our students that Life is God's greatest gift to us and it is our responsibility to live life to its fullest and to be the best person we can be for the glory of God. But, before anyone can become the best person he can be, he has to be allowed to live.

Human life is so precious because we are the only creature made in the image and likeness of God. Psalm 139 reminds us, "You formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb. I praise you, because I am wonderfully made." Even from an ancient age, humankind has known from down deep inside that there is something special about the human race. Ours is the only species that can make such a claim. While the rest of God's Creation is amazing and beautiful, the human race stands out because He made us to be particularly special amongst everything else.

It seems that the Right to Life movement has lost a little moment since the infamous *Roe v. Wade* decision was overturned by the Supreme Court. Even with the wonderful blessing of *Roe v. Wade* being overturned, which allows more freedom at the state level to enact pro-life laws, the necessary work to build a culture of life in the United States of America is not finished. Rather, it is focused differently. Sadly, the number of abortions in the United States annually is still well over 900,000 each year, and that number is expected to decrease only by roughly 200,000 each year in a post-Roe America. Many national legislative battles loom, including even keeping longstanding Hyde protections, which limit government funding for abortion on annual appropriation bills. The Hyde Amendment has saved over 2 million lives and is arguably the most impactful pro-life policy in our nation's history, but now cannot be taken for granted. Last, our most important work is changing hearts and minds. The goal is to not only change laws at the state and federal level, but to change the culture to ultimately make abortion unthinkable.

Our work locally is threefold. First, and most powerfully, we must pray. Pray as individuals, pray as families, pray as peer groups and colleagues, pray as a parish, and pray as and with our community for an end to abortion, not just here in the US but throughout the world. Second, we must support women and families who are in what are termed *crisis* pregnancies. It is our responsibility as the brothers and sisters of Christ to support everyone in making good and holy choices in support of life. Whether it is through volunteering with a pro-life organization, writing a check, or even just speaking out against abortion, we must be willing to act. Finally, we must live our lives in such a way as to fully and truly honor the gift of Life.

Jesus came as one of us for a reason. He came to show us the way to his Father and to show us how to do it as people can. He has, and still does, promised us a happiness so great that we can hardly imagine it. In his own words, "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." John 10 I have a favorite joke that I usually drag out on Independence Day and attribute to Ben Franklin, "Beer is proof that God loves us and wants us to be happy!" Now, while old Ben might have a point, it is not beer that makes us happy, but the gift of life. And Jesus Christ calls us to live that life to its fullest. Part of that fullness is working for the right to life for every person, especially the preborn. If we fail to protect these weakest and most vulnerable, we fail to honor the gift of our own lives and cheapen the sacrifice of the Cross, to delver us from sin and death and call us to salvation.

He came that we might have life and have it more abundantly and we can only do that when every baby in the womb is safe from the scourge of abortion and has the same opportunity that we have all been afforded, the opportunity to live.
