

Francis: The People's Pope

On March 13, 2013, cardinals stunned the world when they elected Pope Francis, the first Latin American Pope. But what did they see in the 76-year-old Jesuit? Who is Jorge Mario Bergoglio?



ROME REPORTS travels to Argentina to investigate and discover more about what shaped Pope Francis. From his only living sister, Maria Elena, to his successor as superior-general of the Jesuits in Argentina, we hear unedited testimonies from those who knew Bergoglio best. Hear from a priest who worked with Bergoglio in the country's slums, and the corner vendor who sold Bergoglio the daily newspaper every day for years. Meet the young man who overcame his addictions with support from the man that the world now calls the Pope.

The documentary begins with the moment that the young Jorge Mario discovers his priestly vocation. After decades of service to the Church, a historic conclave would forever change his life and begin the extraordinary papacy of Francis.

The History of the Caplet of The Divine Mercy

In 1935, St. Faustina received a vision of an angel sent by God to chastise a certain city. She began to pray for mercy, but her prayers were powerless. Suddenly she saw the Holy Trinity and felt the power of Jesus' grace within her. At the same time she found herself pleading with God for mercy with words she heard interiorly:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us. (Diary, 475)

As she continued saying this inspired prayer, the angel became helpless and could not carry out the deserved punishment (see 474). The next day, as she was entering the chapel, she again heard this interior voice, instructing her how to recite the prayer that our Lord later called "the Chaplet." This time, after "have mercy on us" were added the words "and on the whole world" (476). From then on, she recited this form of prayer almost constantly, offering it especially for the dying.

In subsequent revelations, the Lord made it clear that the Chaplet was not just for her, but for the whole world. He also attached extraordinary promises to its recitation.

Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you (1541). Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death (687). When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior (1541). Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this Chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy (687). I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy (687). Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will. (1731)

Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, The Chaplet of The Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist, so it is especially appropriate to use it after having received Holy Communion at Holy Mass. It may be said at any time, but our Lord specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before the Feast of Mercy (the first Sunday after Easter). He then added: "By this Novena, [of Chaplets] I will grant every possible grace to souls." (796)

It is likewise appropriate to pray the Chaplet during the "Hour of Great Mercy" — three o'clock each afternoon (recalling the time of Christ's death on the cross). In His revelations to St. Faustina, Our Lord asked for a special remembrance of His Passion at that hour.

Letter from Father

27 April 2025 2nd Sunday of Easter Divine Mercy and Papal Providence

Greetings,

Like many of you, I was met with the news of the death of Pope Francis first thing Monday morning. With a little reflection and while preparing for the daily Mass that day, I came to the realization that he had died in the Octave of Easter and that witnessing death in such a time certainly helps to reinforce everything that we celebrate in this time.

One of my philosophy professors in college used to point out that, when there is a seeming coincidence that has negative consequences or results, we say it is irony. But, when the same situation has a positive outcome, we call it providence. I submit that the death of our Holy Father so soon following Easter Sunday, there is a certain providence involved. The world watched with concern last month as Pope Francis struggled with pneumonia in the hospital for several weeks, the reports of his returning health or imminent demise seeming to change places several times a day. And when he was finally released from the hospital, there was a general sigh of relief and, I think, a sense that he had once more dodged the proverbial bullet. But, when considering his death in Easter, it would be reasonable to think that he may have sensed his mortal end was near and stuck it out until the holy Season was upon us.

One particularly poignant moment in the public mourning for Pope Francis was the image of Sister Genevieve Jeanningros, who was a long-time close friend of the Pope, entering into the area normally reserved for cardinals and bishops and breaking into tears. In a moment of raw emotion, she burst into tears and brings her hands to her face, as she stands just feet away from the body of the late Pope. Taking a tissue, she wipes her eyes and remains in place for a moment. Despite breaking what is traditionally regarded as protocol, no security official intervened, allowing Francis' close friend an intimate moment of farewell. I saw that moment as an example of the human side of a person of whom we often assign a super-human status. To her he wasn't the Pope, he was her friend.

Regardless of how you might have felt about Pope Francis and his policies and statements, we all must join Holy Mother Church in honoring him as the Successor of Peter and the Vicar of Christ on Earth. Being elected to the papacy does not bestow perfection on a man. Instead, it places on him what is called the "loneliest job in the world". It is during this time of mourning that we must also look towards hope. We pray for the heavenly repose of the soul pf Pope Francis, we pray for the College of Cardinals as they prepare to elect the next Supreme Pontiff, and we pray for the entire Church that a spirit of Charity and hope infuse throughout the world and remain united as the Mystical Body of Christ.
