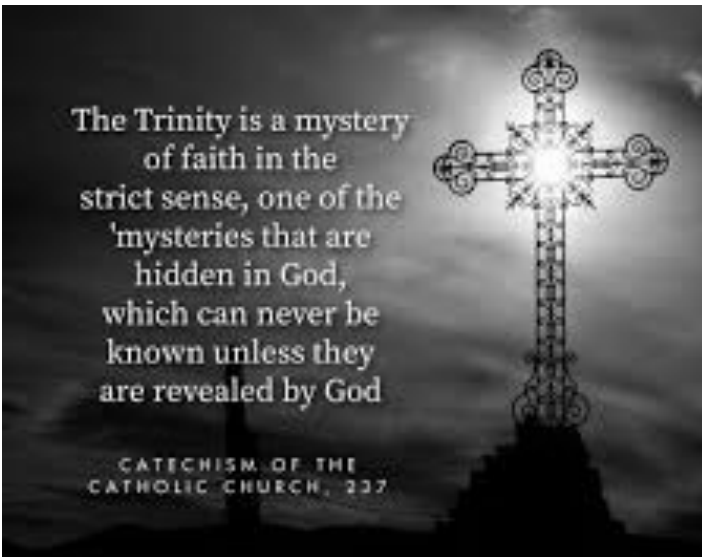

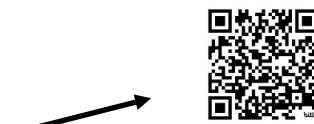

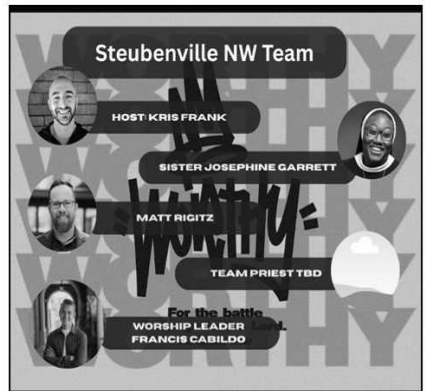

Greetings,

Here we are again, preparing for the end of the school year and getting ready for summer's total disruption of a perfectly good schedule! One of my concerns as a pastor for the summer months is that it is prime season for getting out of the habit of holiness that we do so well during the school year. I get how easy this can be, especially with the opportunities for travel and extended vacations away from our normal lives. I have been working on a family guide for summer to keep the summer months holy and to reinforce those habits that keep us close to God.

First, it is important to maintain those daily and weekly rhythms that help us to grow in faith. Start each day with a simple one-minute family prayer before the day begins. Prayer helps center the family and individual to better take on the day. Before the dinner meal, use the expanded time of summer dinners to pray and share a moment of how you saw God working in the world that day. Also, make Sunday Mass a non-negotiable anchor. Try to visit a different local parish on the weekends you are traveling. Attending Mass, even in a strange town, brings special Grace to families trying to be holy every day.

Next, try some family activities that will help you grow in the Faith. Have each family member pick a "patron saint" for the season, learn about their lives, and ask for their intercession. Then, once a week or so, have one person share something about their saint with the rest of the family and how they might put that saintly virtue into practice. Spend one night a week outside looking at the stars, reading scripture (like Psalm 8), and discussing the beauty of creation. Every week, pick a new Bible verse to memorize together at the dinner table as a way to learn new Scripture and to be better versed in the Bible. We can't let the Protestants have all the fun.

Summer is prime time for family travel and, while you are planning for the fun places and exciting activities, make sure to plan for some special holy places as well. The Pacific Northwest has so many shrines and churches that help us see God more clearly in the world. When you take trips, look for local shrines, grottos, or historic churches along your route to explore as a family. Be witnesses to the world of a Holy Family by praying grace out loud at restaurants and campgrounds when you are traveling. Such a simple action can help inspire others to prayer and a new life in Christ. Finally, pack a "Family on Mission" bag to keep in the car, filled with snacks, bottles of water, and essentials to hand out or donate to those in need. While vacations are meant for us to "get out" of our regular lives, we can never take a break from charity.

Summer vacation doesn't have to mean an atrophied sense of Faith. Instead, it can be a real time of family growth in holiness and a great time to become closer in Christ to one another.

The Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Catholic faith, teaching that there is one God who exists as three distinct, co-equal, and co-eternal Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Here are the core Catholic facts about the Trinity:

The Core Doctrine

- **One in Being, Three in Persons:** God is not three separate gods, nor is He a single person who took on three different roles. Each Person is fully God and possesses the entirety of the divine nature.
- **The "What" and the "Who":** In theology, "nature" refers to *what* a being is, and "person" refers to *who* the being is. God has one divine nature but three distinct divine Persons.

No Confusion or Division: Catholic teaching, formally defined at the Council of Florence, dictates that Catholics must "worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance".

The Distinctions

The three Persons are distinct only in their eternal relationships to one another:

- **The Father:** The first Person of the Trinity who eternally generates the Son.
- **The Son:** The second Person of the Trinity, eternally begotten by the Father. (e.g., Jesus Christ is the Incarnation of the Son).

The Holy Spirit: The third Person of the Trinity, who eternally "proceeds" from both the Father and the Son (also known as the *Filioque*).

Historical & Liturgical Facts

Infallible Definitions: The doctrine was formally clarified and defined to combat early heresies (such as Arianism) at the First Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. and the First Council of Constantinople in 381 A.D..

- **Baptismal Formula:** The Trinity is the reason Catholics baptize in the singular "name" of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, highlighting the unity of the three Persons.

Trinity Sunday: Celebrated on the first Sunday after Pentecost, the Church dedicates this major solemnity to explicitly contemplate and honor the mystery of the Triune God.

You can read more about the inner life of God and the Church's teachings in the Catechism of the Catholic Church.
