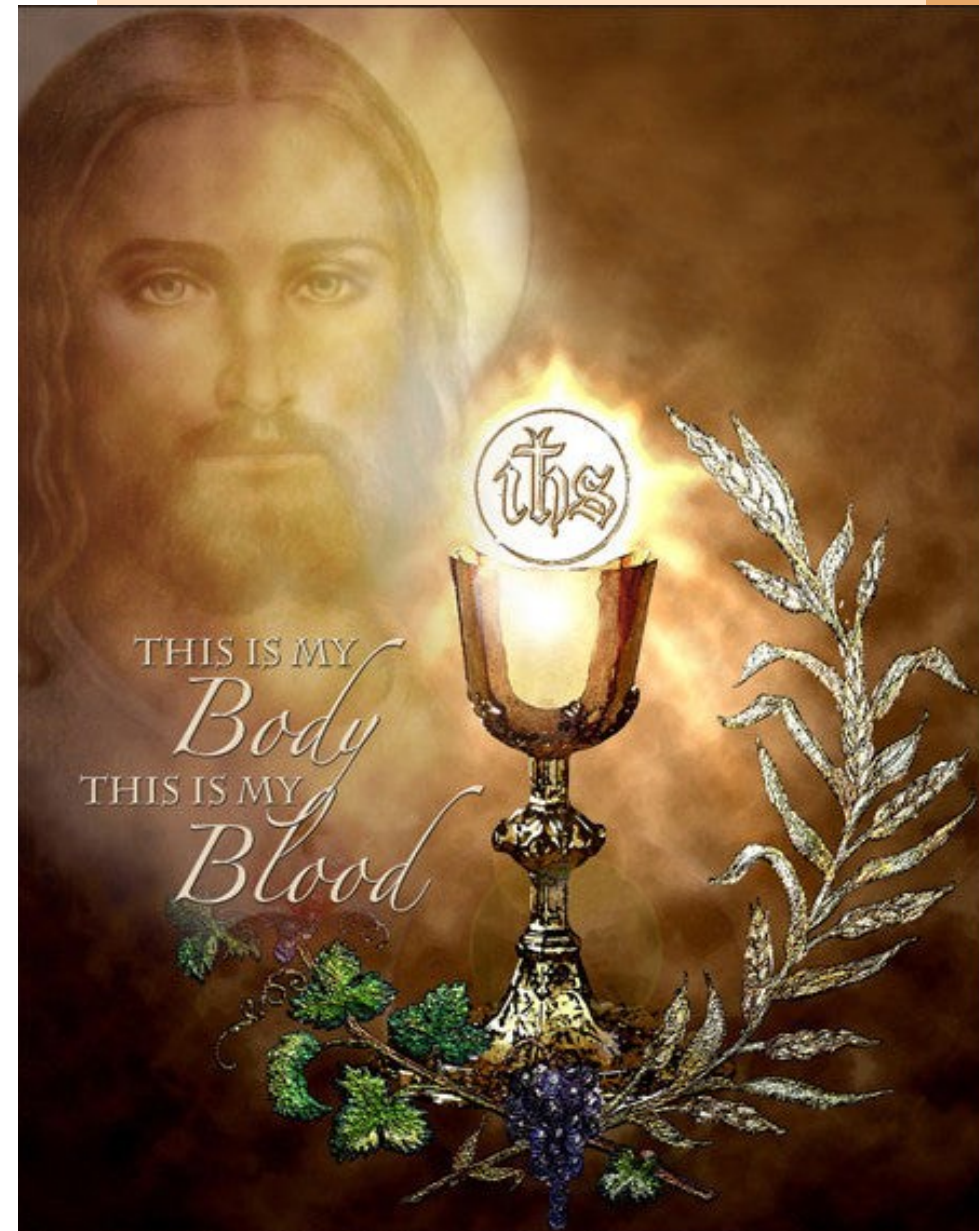

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known as **Corpus Christi**, celebrates the **Real Presence** of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. It honors the transformation of bread and wine into the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ during Mass.

**Core Belief:** The feast centers on the doctrine of **Transubstantiation** – the teaching that the substance of the bread and wine changes entirely into the substance of Jesus's Body and Blood, even though the physical appearance remains.

**Origins:** It was established in 1264 by Pope Urban IV. This followed the **Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena**, where a consecrated host reportedly began to bleed onto an altar cloth, dispelling a visiting priest's doubts about the Real Presence.

**The Liturgy & Procession:** The day is famous for public **Eucharistic processions**. The Blessed Sacrament is placed in an ornate monstrance and carried by the clergy through streets or church grounds, allowing the faithful to publicly bear witness to their faith.

Greetings,

Wednesday night I had a conversation with a young man who is graduating from high school and has been accepted to a very good university. I asked him if he had any plans for the summer and he replied, "Oh, I'm just going to work harvest, maybe drive combine". I replied to him, "Oh, I'm just going to feed the world in my spare time." His response reminded me of the many things that people do for a living that are discounted or not thought of as "good" jobs because they aren't glamorous or they are taken for granted. I recently asked some of our students if they notice when the trash collectors come to their homes or when the cleaners come clean the school. They said they didn't notice. I asked them if they noticed when their mom did the laundry or when their dad made dinner. Again, for the most part, the answer was "No". Then I asked them if they would notice if those people stopped doing those things, how long would it take them to notice? The answer was, "Pretty quickly, I guess."

So much of the mundane and everyday blue-collar work that is done here in Clarkston, in the State of Washington, in the United States, and around the world that is vital for the survival and comfort of every person is work that requires the worker to "get his hands dirty". And, since over the past fifty years or so, respect for that work has waned as the emphasis has shifted towards a focus on academic advancement and professional careers. While it is good that our society has advanced to a point where more and more people are able to train for and take jobs that are easier on the body than much of the traditional trades and service work, it is just as negative that we have started to look down on people who choose the trades or service work as somehow less capable or less intelligent.

Psalm 90 ends with the words, "May the favor of the Lord our God be ours. May He Prosper the work of our hands." When we look at the value of human labor, it must be through the lens of humility which makes us appreciate the there are people willing to do the hard work of farming, construction, maintenance, and transportation to name a few, so that we can live in relative ease and comfort. How happy and thankful I am that I don't have to get up at four in the morning to milk cows or feed cattle or pave roads or carry drywall. It is vital that we do not look down on the people who do manual labor for a living, but that we look at them thankfully for the vital services they perform.

Pope St. John Paul II wrote in his 1981 encyclical letter *Laborem Exercens*, "Work is one of the characteristics that distinguish man from the rest of creatures, whose activity for sustaining their lives cannot be called work. Only man is capable of work, and only man works, at the same time by work occupying his existence on earth." He added that, "he shares by his work in the activity of the Creator."


*Work by any person is to be valued. Whether that work is behind a desk in an office, behind a bench in a workshop, behind the steering wheel of a tractor or truck, or behind the handle of a shovel or rake, it is each person's contribution to the life and well-being of the world. Work is not something to be feared or disdained but, instead, a virtue to be pursued for the greater glory of God.*
